May is for Music: PorchFest Returns May 7!

Have you missed live music during the COVID-imposed seclusion of the last two years? Wait no more. PorchFest returns to Alta Vista and Beacon Hill on May 7, 2022, from 12:30 to 7 pm! "It's a slightly precarious time coming out of COVID," said Jen Khoshbin, Alta Vista resident and PorchFest organizer. "People are still finding their way back to fully socializing, and we feel a relaxing outdoor event like Porchfest is a great fit for everyone right now."

Since 2017, PorchFest has been bringing these neighborhoods together by having six neighbors provide a porch for a local musical act. The acts are staggered throughout time and space, so the audience can walk from one to another without missing a set or a beat. Each set starts on the hour and plays for 45 minutes, enabling transit time to the next address with a comfortable margin to settle into your folding chairs. Colorful Community: Music on Magnolia

Age is no object at Music on Magnolia; ages two through six can enjoy "Eurythmics," a guided discovery of important concepts like dynamics, rhythms, articulation, and form. Adult students are

Michael Kelly has been bringing music to the ears of Alta Vista since his studio, Music on Magnolia, actually operated on W. Magnolia Ave. Founded in his grandmother's bungalow in 2014, the music school relocated to a former law office on San Pedro Blvd. in 2020. 2715 San Pedro is now where the magic – and music –happens.

Today the studio stands in the noticeable cottage on the southwest corner of San Pedro and Fulton. Why noticeable?

The colors rival Fiesta flags' bold palette. Music on Magnolia was painted by Rudy Herrera, the artist who last year designed and executed "The Last Parade" in Centro San Antonio's Kress Building. Herrera's vibrant colors express the atmosphere found within: creative and expressive of individual style.

Kelly's lessons focus on having fun and jamming with friends. He and his instructors encourage students to experiment with any and all instruments and noisemakers. Music on Magnolia offers not just introductions to the world of music, but also two tracks for young musicians: classical/ traditional lessons and a performance path. The classical route empowers kids who may be a little shy or not interested in performing in public to develop their skills individually.

"We take a 'boutique' approach to music," Kelly said. "Some places focus mostly on classical music on piano and guitar, but we also form a community of performers."

The performance path trains and prepares students to play in a band, all while having a lot of fun. Kids' bands form and grow organically, with one young performer meeting others who has complementary musical styles and goals.

"Our instructors are all about performance," said Kelly. "We are gigging musicians who play multiple instruments and have music degrees."
