AV EYED FOR MORE 3-STORY DWELLINGS!

The Alta Vista Neighborhood Association is back in action after our Summer "slow down"; though we don't meet nor publish a newsletter during this time, we're not calling it a "break" because the issues are non-stop! In addition to several upcoming neighborhood events, there's quite a bit happening. Let's start with three important items that will be on the agenda at our next General Assembly meeting on October 11.

Representatives of the property owner at **133 Hickman** will be in attendance to discuss with us a vision for a total of 3 three-story, single-family dwellings on this ~7,000 sq ft lot, changes which do not seem possible without rezoning and deviating from code and parts of the Neighborhood Conversation District (NCD) design standards that AV neighbors put in place.

We'll also be joined by the owners of four adjacent multi-family-zoned properties on **Lynwood** (418, 424, 430,432) to hear their vision for more greenspace and density that would require big changes to zoning and deviations from the NCD that could in the future allow for one large apartment building.

Development projects have their pros and cons and they always have the most immediate impact on surrounding neighbors, so please don't miss this opportunity to learn more and ask questions in a respectful environment. Finally, we'll hear from CEO Asia Ciaravino and Managing Director Christina

Casella from **The Public Theater in San Pedro Springs Park**, both which call Alta Vista home. The Classic Theater has taken residency in the cozy 60-seat Cellar space at The Public for the current season, while production in the main space is on hold for a fundraising effort. We'll hear more about this and other opportunities to support our beloved spot for local theater and hopefully learn more about their vision for the former Pho Sur property across the street at 741 Ashby.

New Councilwoman's Priorities and Other Neighborhood Business

In August AVNA board members Cheryl Dozier and Erin Zayko attended an event organized by an informal group of District 1 neighborhood association leaders, including AVNA President Katie Corr, to welcome new District 1 Councilwoman Sukh Kaur and her staff. Councilwoman Kaur emphasized her priorities including economic development and small businesses, zoning and planning issues, low barrier housing, and increasing the city budget for Animal Care Services. Later in August, board members met one-on-one with the new D1 team to orient them to the long and ongoing list of specific concerns from our neighbors, including this partial list:

- Pickup and drop off around Mark Twain Middle School.
- Theft, drugs and other issues for multiple properties in the 900 block of Ashby.
- Vacant properties such as 800 W. Russell (has burned twice), 410 W. Magnolia (burned once), 741 W. Ashby, and 527 W. Mistletoe squatted in by the chronically homeless.
- San Pedro Springs Park: crime, encampments, destruction of park property, litter and future bond improvements.

We'll also share with them the results of our very informal poll where several neighbors showed support for a new sidewalk on the west side of N. Flores from Summit to Magnolia.

- Technical Committee Be familiar with the Neighborhood's Conservation District standards; fairly gather neighbor input at meetings; and help to recommend positions related to rezoning and property related requests.

Board of Directors Election November 15

The Alta Vista Neighborhood Association (AVNA) is a voluntary 501c4 civic organization registered with the City of San Antonio. As such, we receive notifications and inquiries from the City and other entities about issues directly affecting the neighborhood. We strive to fairly and impartially represent members' interests in these matters. AVNA also communicates regularly with residents to exchange information and receive requests for assistance and hosts social and educational events to strengthen neighborhood bonds and a sense of community. The Board of Directors works with committees and other volunteers to accomplish the above.

Our by-laws call for eight (8) AVNA Board Members; seven of which are elected each year for a one-year term starting in January: 1) President; 2) Vice President; 3) Treasurer; 4) Secretary; and 5) Three At Large directors. The eighth member of the BOD is the Immediate Past President.

Board Eligibility, Time Commitment, and Description

Any regular or business member is eligible. Board Members are expected to attend 9 board meetings (typically virtual) and 5 in-person general assembly meetings and to help the President set the agenda. The President or their designee acts as the AVNA spokesperson and only votes at meetings in the event of a tie. The Vice President supports the President as needed. The Secretary keeps minutes of proceedings and the Treasurer manages AVNA's funds. At Large members typically chair standing or ad hoc committees, and the VP, Secretary, and Treasurer may do so as well. Candidates interested in joining the Board of Directors should send an email to the Nominating Committee at avna@altavistana.org by 11/5/2023 with the following information: name, email address, phone number, why you would like to serve on the board and what position(s) you would consider holding, and which neighborhood issues are most important to you. Elections will be held at the General Assembly meeting on 11/15/2023. Nominations from the floor are also welcome.
