Drainage Project Hurting Oscar de la Tienda; Six More Months Until Complete



The drainage project along N. Flores and W. Russell will make Alta Vista safer and bring updated roads, sidewalks, and curbs, but the work to alleviate dangerous flood waters is hurting business at Oscar de la Tienda (ODLT)—a dynamic store that supports the adjoining arts and community space on the corner of these two streets operated by proprietor and realtor Cynthia Gomez.

"Her shop is where you can feel the heartbeat of the neighborhood," says patron Caitlin Foose. "You can grab basic necessities, buy a sandwich, coffee and local art, meet and mingle with neighbors and spend an evening listening to a local band if you wish."

From oil paintings by Shea Daniel, to custom pens by Edin Rich Designs, to tasty drink mixers by

Bexar Tonics, ODLT sells the work of many local artisans. Several groups, such as the Jazz Poets of San Antonio and Seniors at Play (non-profit theatre workshop), use the open community space, aka the "green room", at no cost, a service that Gomez hopes to continue to provide, though she doesn't rule out renting the space to the right tenant. "I envision there always being free space at Oscar for emerging artists and musicians," says Gomez.

In just a short time, this eclectic convenience store has become a much-appreciated walkable destination for neighbors and those passing through in their cars. Unfortunately, it has been near impossible to do that for several months now due to the ongoing construction.

Proceeds to pay for operational expenses.

For her part, Gomez is in contact with District 1 Councilman Mario Bravo and has applied to CPS Energy for utility assistance; to use less energy, she is participating in CPS' small business energy efficiency program. Despite Gomez's evident investment on that corner, operating and maintaining an old building while facing a decline in customers due to the construction may mean closing the business. She hopes that signs recently provided by Public Works indicating that the store is open will help until traffic flow is restored.

That may come soon, at least somewhat. "The project from West Ashby to West Russell should be complete [weather permitting] by January 31, thereby opening North Flores," says CoSA Capital Projects Officer. Patricia McWilliams.

But new street closures on W. Russell and then Breeden will continue to impact ODLT and neighbors. "A different contractor will perform the work on W. Russell," says McWilliams. The entire drainage project is slated to be complete in the Summer. A detailed schedule of construction for the next portion of the project will be available soon.

Wicked Wich Is Moving and Growing (Another Great Reason to Love Oscar de la Tienda)

Think of Oscar de la Tienda as a small-business incubator, and the Wicked Wich as the chick who was hatched at the store. After much success in the food space at Oscar, Wicked Wich owner Felisa Salazar is expanding into her own space. She'll be serving up her delicious sandwiches along with a wider menu of soups, salads, sides, and beer and wine at a new location at 825 Fredericksburg Road, just down W. Russell St. in Beacon Hill, in the same strip as Bexar Kolaches, across from Garcia's Tacos. "Alta Vista, don't be a stranger!" says Salazar. Look for the grand opening of the relocated Wicked Wich at the beginning of February. Two new food vendors are coming soon to ODLT.
