# Alta Vista Traffic Islands

n September 2019, the City of San Antonio mowed down the landscaping on the traffic islands at W. Gramercy/Breeden and W. Kings/Breeden much to the dismay of the neighborhood. This was the result of a 311 complaint that they were overgrown.

The traffic islands were installed and landscaped by AVNA in memory of Jimmy Contreras and Jessica Zembala. Jimmy and Jessica were instrumental in many aspects of neighborhood planning and beautification for years. They both passed away in 2003. Over the years the community maintained the traffic island landscaping through volunteer work days. Unfortunately, the effort ultimately lost momentum and they became unsightly.



Since that time, a coalition of the AVNA Board and community



members have been

working on breathing new life into the beautification of the traffic islands. The General Assembly approved submittal of an application to the city to give AVNA formal "Adopt A Spot" responsibility for maintaining

the islands in December 2019. Erik Hausmann, then spearheaded brick fund raiser campaign for

landscaping materials and benches. The benches were installed in 2022 and the brick paths are scheduled to be installed this spring. Drought resistant foliage will be added later. AVNA is planning on having an event to rededicate the



islands in memory of Jimmy and Jessica, so stay tuned for more information. If you would like to volunteer to help lead the next phase of the effort or help to beautify the traffic islands, please send your interest to avna@altavistana.org

## Neighborhood Business: Code Compliance, NCD, Vacant Properties

A VNA is a voluntary association registered with the City of San Antonio (CoSA) and a 501c4 civic organization. As such, the Board of Directors (BOD) receives notifications from CoSA and questions and concerns from residents of Alta Vista regarding a variety of issues in our neighborhood. This is a roundup of some recent activity:

o 946 W. Ashby – Received notice from Development Services that the Building Standards Board held a meeting on March 2, 2023 to determine if the property constitutes a public nuisance in need of abatement. Neighbor complaints about that property and properties in that area have also been received.

o 705 W. Craig – Brought to the BOD's attention by a neighbor, this new home isn't in compliance with AVNA Neighborhood Conservation District design guidelines. Development Services reports that the developer will be submitting an application to the Board of Adjustment for variances to the vertical 2:1 window requirement and the 25% surface area dedication for the front façade window openings; this issue is not yet on the BOA agenda.
o 500 block of W. Agarita – At the request of neighbors, the BOD wrote a letter to a property owner requesting that the property be brought into code compliance and to note that the property has been recommended as a candidate for the Vacant Buildings program.
o 800 W. Craig – This vacant, burned property is currently part of the Vacant Buildings

program, and (after a long history of issues) has a new owner.

o 400 block of W. Magnolia – Multiple code violations and complaints received; code compliance opened a case with the property owner.

### Sidewalk Talk

Sidewalks are technically property owner's responsibility. The City offers a limited Sidewalk Rebate Program for those property owners who wish to hire a contractor to repair their sidewalks. Visit the Sidewalk Rebate Program for more details.

#### When Rover Goes Roving... How To Report Loose Dogs in Our Neighborhood

**C**all 311. Provide as much information as possible: color; breed; with collar or without; aggressive; visibly sick or injured; alone or in a pack. Give factual, accurate details. Animal Control Officers (ACOs) are much fewer in number than police. Officers do not respond as quickly as the police. You can also file reports online at 311, sanantonio.gov, or sa.gov or by downloading the city's new 311 mobile app.

Slowing down by just 5 mph, from 30 mph to 25 mph, means a pedestrian is half as likely to be seriously injured or killed in a crash. We encourage everyone to enjoy a slow ride through our lovely neighborhood to keep everyone safer.

According to the American Automobile Association, "the average risk of severe injury for a pedestrian struck by a vehicle reaches 25% at 23 mph, 50% at 31 mph, 75% at 39 mph, and 90% at 46 mph. The average risk of death for a pedestrian reaches 10% at an impact speed of 23 mph, 25% at 32 mph, 50% at 42 mph, 75% at 50 mph, and 90% at 58 mph" (https://aaafoundation.org/impact-speed-pedestrians-risk-severe-injury-death/).
