The great turnout for last month's General Assembly meeting speaks to the way we come together to address issues facing our neighborhood. And it means so much to your hard-working Board of Directors (BOD) when you show up! Thank you!

Speaking of neighborhood leadership, we'll be electing the 2024 BOD at the Nov 29 meeting.

We'll also be joined by VIA Metropolitan Transit regarding "ART" aka the **Advanced Rapid Transit** North/South Corridor Project. ART vehicles will run in dedicated and mixed-use lanes from the San Antonio International Airport area, along San Pedro Avenue, through Downtown, and south to the Missions area. After several public meetings earlier this year, construction plans are being finalized now with construction to commence in 2025. Come to the meeting to learn about how the new lanes will greatly change the way we traverse San Pedro today.

Also on the agenda is a discussion about the status of plans to improve issues with **traffic flow around**Mark Twain Middle School and some inconsiderate parents blocking driveways and littering while picking up and dropping off their kiddos.

Say Goodbye to the Midtown Plan (2000-2023)

Back in the early aughts, the neighborhoods of Alta Vista, Beacon Hill, and St. Anne's worked with the City to create the Midtown Neighborhood Plan (MNP), which among other things established "land uses" (commercial, residential etc.). Land use designations are very important because they represent preferred land development patterns for our area and they dictate what kind of zoning each property can have.

Our longstanding MNP will soon be replaced by the Near North Community Plan which Alta Vista will share with several other neighborhoods: Beacon Hill, Maverick, Jefferson, Woodlawn Lake, Monticello Park, Los Angeles Heights, Keystone, Monte Vista Terrace, Monte Vista, and River Road.

The change is an effort by the City to align all existing neighborhood plans under 30 new "sub-area" plans as part of implementing the SA Tomorrow Comprehensive Plan. The alignment is meant to "provide a consistent set of categories and definitions for use across all 30 plans."

The update process will kick-off soon. Developing the Near North Community Plan will take months if not an entire year. It will be lead by the city and participation won't be limited to neighborhoods—businesses, non-profits and other stakeholders will also be included at the discretion of the Planning Department. "The end result of these 30 sub-area plans will be a complete land use map for the City of San Antonio, something which currently does not exist." That may sound good, but Alta Vista must be at the table to make sure the updates are right for the neighborhood.

Your hard-working Board of Directors and members of the Technical Committee will do our best to represent you fairly and transparently, attending every meeting and sharing information via our regular outlets.
